- a For all requested measures, states should report actual counts, NOT percent of total.
- b This total should include only PCR tests for viral material OR blood antigen tests (sensitivity >95%) if they become available. This total should NEVER include blood antibody tests. Multiple tests for the same child should NOT be included.
- c Multiple positive tests for the same child should NOT be included.
- d This total should include inpatient admissions only. Multiple hospitalizations for the same child should NOT be included.
- e Categorization of COVID-19 deaths for children should follow the [NCHS guidance on COVID-19 cause of death determination](#). Death counts should NOT be suppressed because of small numbers.
- e For consistency, all states should report data using [standard NIH definitions for racial and ethnic groups](#), with the additional categories of *Multiracial* and *Other*. At minimum, all states should report data for the three largest racial/ethnic groups of children in the US (Black non-Hispanic, Hispanic, and White non-Hispanic), and report expanded data for cases representing other racial/ethnic groups where applicable.
